LAWS OF FLORIDA 2000-399 AND FLORIDA STATUTE 99.061, 99.095, 99.097, 106.021, 189.405

Qualified electors residing within the district elect the Captiva Erosion Prevention District board commissioners. District boundaries are coterminous with the boundaries of the Captiva Island Fire Control District. Board commissioners are elected in the General Election of even numbered election years to a 4-year term. This is a non-partisan office.

A vacancy on the board shall be filled, by appointment, by the remaining board commissioners for the remainder of the unexpired term. A board commissioner takes office the 1st Tuesday after the 1st Monday in January following the General Election. [FS 100.041]

The Lee County Clerk of the 20th Judicial Circuit Court is elected, at large, in the Primary or General Election. This can be a 2-year or 4-year, partisan, minor party or no party affiliation constitutional office. The Lee County Clerk of the 20th Judicial Circuit Court serves as an elected constitutional officer, under the Constitution of the State of Florida and the Office of the Governor. The Lee County Clerk of the 20th Judicial Circuit Court, or his/her deputy, shall reside in the county seat or within 2 miles thereof.

A vacancy in the office of Lee County Clerk of the 20th Judicial Circuit Court shall be filled pursuant to Florida Statute 100.111 or Article IV § 1(f) of the Constitution of the State of Florida. The clerk of the circuit court takes office on 1st Tuesday after 1st Monday in January following the General Election. [FS 100.041]

Qualified electors residing within district in Hendry and Lee counties elect board commissioners in the General Election. This is a 2-year or 4-year term, non-partisan office.

A vacancy on the Board shall be filled pursuant to section 189.405(3),(a), Florida Statutes—see section 100.111 Florida Statutes (Filling Vacancy). A commissioner shall take office at the first regularly scheduled board meeting after certification of the election.

In the 2006, initial election of (7) board commissioners, seat terms shall be as follows: the (3) candidates receiving the highest number of votes shall serve 4-year terms until 2010 and the (4) remaining candidates shall serve 2-year terms until 2008.

A vacancy on the board, shall be filled by the remaining board commissioners by appointment until the next general election. A board commissioner takes office the 7th day after his/her election.

CANDIDATE FOR SPECIAL DISTRICT OFFICE MUST:

A candidate for a position on the governing board of a special district, that has its elections conducted by the Lee County Supervisor of Elections, shall qualify with the Lee County Supervisor of Elections.
